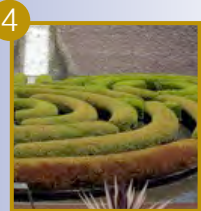

Heads Up!

New height restrictions for vehicles are now in place for the lower-level pickup lanes at LAX through next summer.

The height clearance has been reduced to 10 feet 6 inches (a 3 foot reduction) to allow for replacement of roadway bearing pads in areas where arriving passengers exit the airport. This affects the two covered terminal-facing roadway lanes on LAX's lower level.

LAX 'Lunch with Heroes' Event Hosts 200 Marines at USO

The first Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) and community-sponsored "Lunch with Our Heroes" event acknowledging military heroes at the Bob Hope Hollywood USO brought together airport employees and representatives from businesses, chambers of commerce, and service clubs on July 1 for a good cause.

More than 200 Marines from Twentynine Palms and Camp Pendleton arrived at LAX in chartered buses and were greeted by warm, smiling volunteers who served them Italian subs, chips, cookies, goody bags with treats, and cold refreshments.

Despite the warm weather, the Marines enjoyed their meals under the sun before going off sightseeing or catching flights.

"The event illustrated the enormous and consistent support the USO has throughout the LAX community – including our local chambers of commerce, Rotary Clubs, airport employees and airport tenants," said Los Angeles World Airports Deputy Executive Director **David Shuter**, a retired U.S. Marine with 31 years in the Corps.

"Lunch with Our Heroes," initiated and coordinated by LAX Community Relations staff, came about due to the generosity of community sponsors and supporters of the Bob Hope Hollywood USO.

Organizations such as the Airport Association of Employees, Rotary Clubs of El Segundo, Inglewood, and Westchester, in addition to the Inglewood and Culver City chambers of commerce, contributed to and solidified a community partnership with the USO at LAX.

More than 69,000 troops and their families, as well as traveling military retirees, visit the Bob Hope Hollywood USO at LAX annually. This is the flagship operation of the USO-Greater Los Angeles Area, Inc., which also has a USO center at LA/Ontario International Airport.

The non-stop service operates between 6:45 a.m. and 11:45 a.m. daily. The bus stop is located at 1875 Main St. in front of the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium. Service is provided 15 minutes before each hour. Fare is \$8 one way.*

LAWA Receives 2 Environmental Achievement Awards

Los Angeles World Airports has been honored with two 2014 Environmental Achievement Awards for Los Angeles International Airport's (LAX) Air Quality and Source Apportionment Study and its LAX Dunes Endangered El Segundo Blue Butterfly Recovery and Habitat Restoration Project by Airports Council International – North America (ACI-NA). The entries were submitted by LAWAs Environmental Services Division, which manages both activities.

ACI-NA's panel of judges applauded the Air Quality and Source Apportionment

Study submission and chose to recognize it as runner-up "due to its complexity, technical innovation and outcomes that yielded useful, previously unavailable information for the airport, the city of Los Angeles and the airport's surrounding communities."

This study, submitted in the Innovative/Special Projects category, is the first of its kind to comprehensively assess a major airport's contribution to ambient air quality levels in nearby communities. Researchers gathered more information for the study about the air quality impacts

of airport operations than anyone had ever before collected.

This multi-year project included an advisory technical working group of air quality scientists and researchers on the federal, state, and local levels, as well as community organizations.

Judges selected the LAX Dunes Endangered El Segundo Blue Butterfly Recovery and Habitat Restoration Project submission for runner-up within the Mitigation category "due to its clear and precise implementation plan."
