"Day of Discovery" was a big success with an overall attendance of 400+ attendees and exhibitors at the LMU campus. This was LAX's first community, aviation and aerospace expo in partnership with LMU.

The event featured General Kevin Chilton, who piloted the Space Shuttle Endeavour and was a Space Shuttle Atlantis Commander, as guest speaker followed by an interactive program that directly serviced and benefitted our local communities and introduced attendees to the world of aviation.

The expo hosted 25 exhibits that included representatives from NASA, Boeing, Embry-Riddle University, FAA, March Field Air Museum, LAWA's PUP Program, Cal State LA's Aviation program, the Flight Path Learning Center & Museum, Aero Club of Southern California, the Columbia Space Center Museum, Women in Aviation-LA Chapter, World Space, and World Trade Week.



USO COLLECTION DRIVE



LAX collected 1,500 travel-sized health and personal care items for members of the military and their families at the Bob Hope USO. During the two-week drive, employees generously donated small, easy-to-carry toiletries such as deodorant, sunscreen, and toothpaste.

The inspiration for the drive was to acknowledge military personnel who have served, in addition to those who are serving in the U.S. Armed Forces. AIRPORT POLICE GOES GREEN



The Airport Police Department (APD) is helping with LAWA sustainability when it comes to air emissions. Sgt. Adonis Cutchlow, who is in charge of the APD Fleet Services Unit, said that they have 355 fleet vehicles including alternative energy-type vehicles: two T3 chariots; eleven Segways; approximately 40 bicycles (Bicycle Patrol Unit); and four electric vehicles. APD is also testing two additional electric vehicles.

The Bicycle Patrol Unit, which supports the Patrol Services Section, maintains a high level of public contact with airport tenants, employees and passengers, and responds to calls for service in designated patrol areas and in the terminals. With the ability to travel on sidewalks, and can easily bypass traffic, bicycles make an excellent alternative to vehicle transportation.

PROCUREMENT PROGRAM FOR LAX LANDSIDE ACCESS MODERNIZATION PROGRAM (LAMP)

In November, the Los Angeles Board of Airport Commissioners announced plans to deliver a world-class transportation system to LAX through the estimated \$5-billion Landside Access Modernization Program (LAMP). LAMP's centerpiece will be an Automated People Mover (APM) that will connect the Central Terminal Area (CTA) with a new Consolidated Rent-A-Car facility (CONRAC), with stops in-between at new airport parking facilities and a station connecting to the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) regional transit system.

In early 2016, LAWA will host an Industry Forum to provide program information and receive industry feedback on the delivery and procurement framework that would encourage competition, innovation, and certainty through

delivery. A Small Business Enterprise (SBE) event will also be held to encourage and facilitate the participation of SBEs and minority-, women- and locally-owned businesses. To register for the Industry Forum and additional events, visit the www.connectinglax.com website.

LAX NORTH COMPLEX OUTBOARD RUNWAY 24R/6L REOPENED

LAX completed the Runway Safety Area (RSA) improvements for runway 24R/6L on the north runway complex and reopened runway 24R/6L on October 5, 2015, two weeks ahead of schedule. The north outboard runway had been closed since June 29, 2015 to allow construction of the RSA improvements.

The reopening of runway 24R/6L will enable LAX to return to normal runway use for departure and arrival operations. The next phase of the RSA project started construction in November 2015.

RSA improvements are mandated by Congress for all U.S. airports. The improvements are intended to provide an extra margin of safety for landing and departing aircraft. LAX is phasing the RSA construction, one runway at a time, and will conduct regular runway maintenance during these construction periods to minimize noise and operational impacts.
